Destruction of UXOs and AXO by the EOD teams was done during the year. Mostly ERW such as 60mmRPGs, Anti – tank mine Detonators, Anti-Air wall-heads, Anti-Air Projectiles, hand grenades and cartridges of Anti-Air ammunition were destroyed in situ.

## FORM I MEASURES TO PROVIDE WARNING TO THE POPULATION

- Article 7.1 "Each State Party shall report to the Secretary-General...on:
- i) The measures taken to provide an immediate and effective warning to the population in relation to all areas identified under paragraph 2 of Article 5".

*Remark:* In accordance with Article 5, para.2.: "each State Party shall make every effort to identify all areas under its jurisdiction or control in which anti-personnel mines are known or suspected to be emplace and shall ensure as soon as possible that all anti-personnel mines in mined areas under its jurisdiction or control are perimeter-marked, monitored and protected by fencing or other means, to ensure the effective exclusion of civilians, until all anti-personnel mines contained therein have been destroyed. The marking shall at least be of the standards set out in the Protocol on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Mines, Booby-Traps and Other Devices, as amended on 3 May 1996, annexed to the Convention on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Certain Conventional Weapons Which May Be Excessively Injurious or to Have Indiscriminate Effects".

The following suspected mined areas have been marked and are still awaiting further clearance:

- a. Mweshang'ombe in Sable Game Park, Chongwe District, Lusaka Province.
- b. Lukulusitu in Shangombo District, Western Province – Partial clearance was undertaken during the year through inter-ministerial collaboration. However, further clearance is still to be undertaken.

*[Narrative / reference to other reports:]*

A nationwide data collection/survey of landmine victims was conducted during 2007. This was facilitated mostly through funds from CIDA Canada through UNICEF. 110 survivors were identified from 89 communities in suspected/known hazardous areas of the six contaminated provinces surveyed across the country. In addition a total of 54 health facilities were identified and personnel earmarked for future training in 2008 in managing landmine and ERW survivors.
