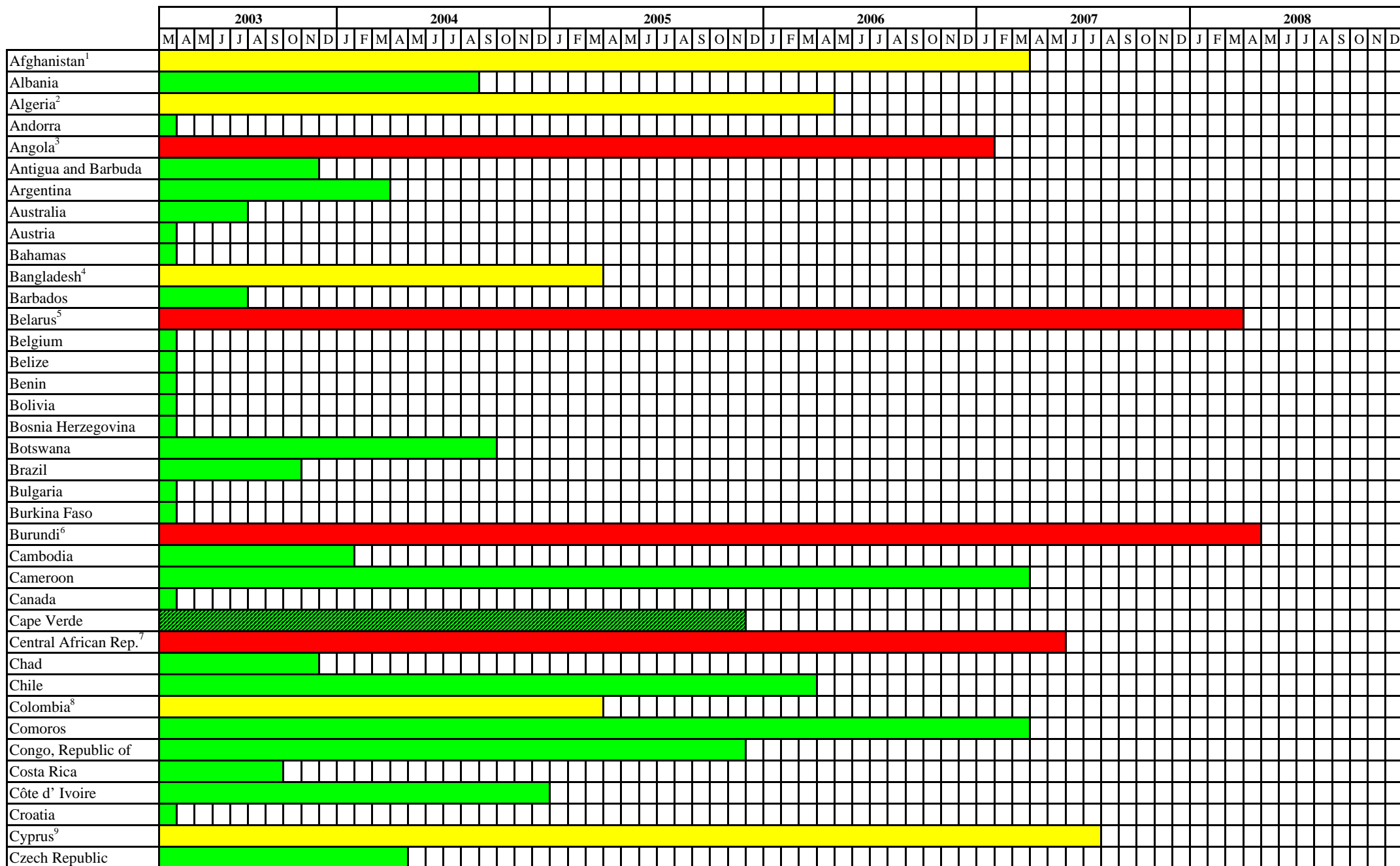

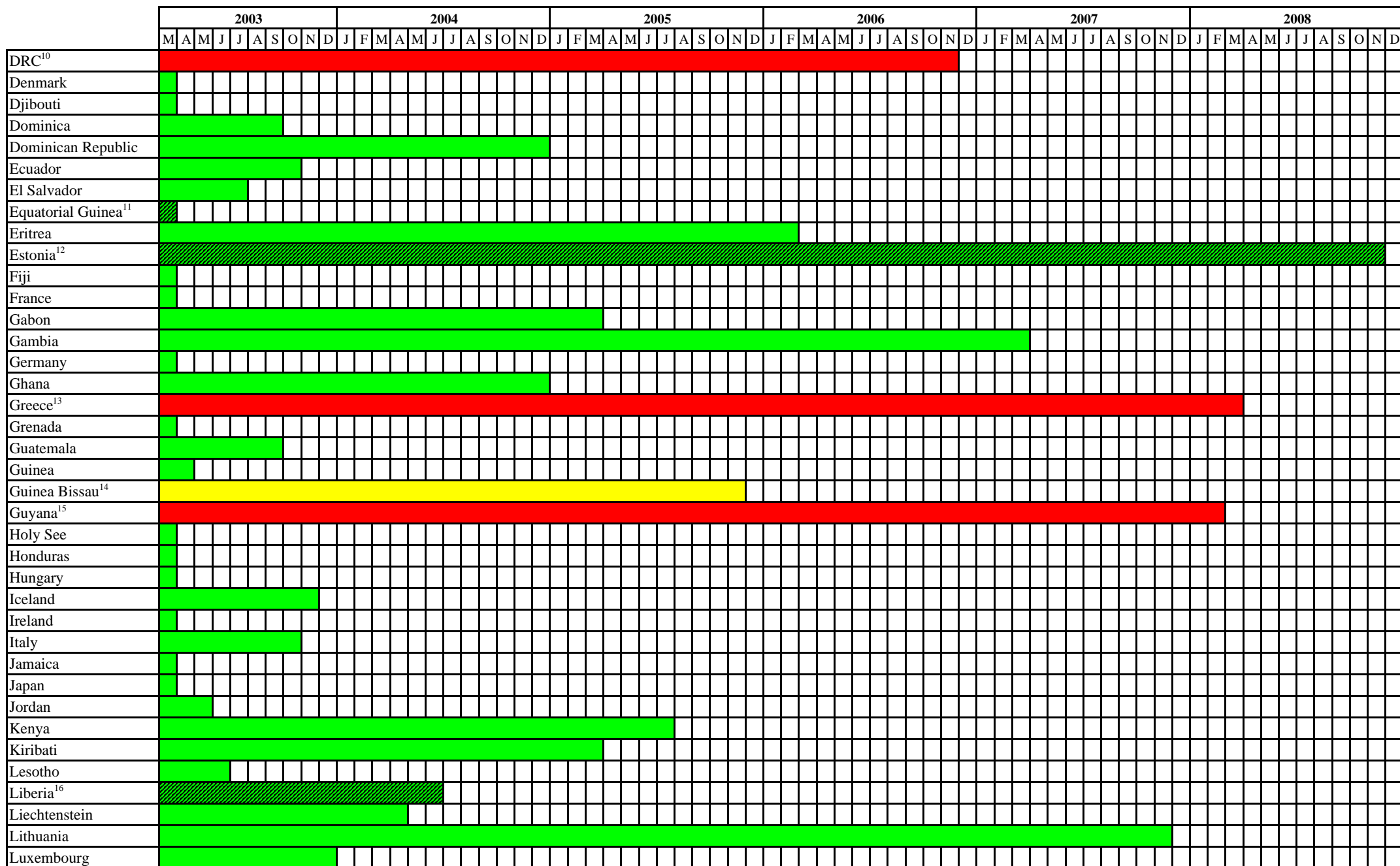

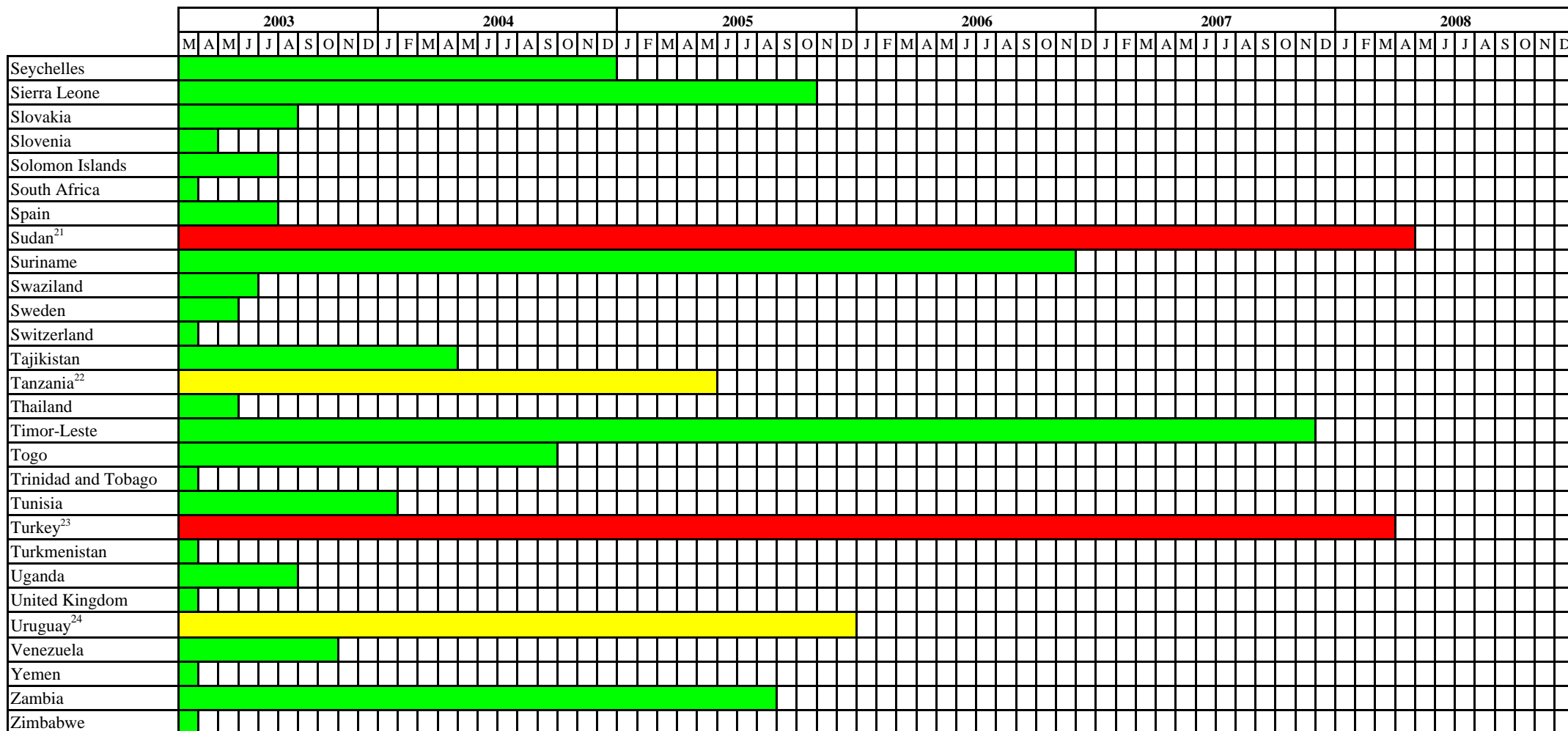

Time-lines for the implementation of Article 4



- Key:
- States Parties that reported they either have completed stockpile destruction or, have never held mine stockpiles.
 - States Parties for which Article 7 information has not been made available but are presumed to not hold stockpiles (based upon other information sources).
 - States Parties that are in the process of destroying stockpiles.
 - States Parties that have not begun stockpile destruction or, if Article 7 information has not been made available (or has not yet been required) are presumed to possess stockpiles and have not yet begun destruction.

Time-lines for the implementation of Article 4

- ¹ Most recent Article 7 report (April 30, 2004) indicates total number of stockpiles unknown and that a "Draft Strategic Plan for the National Destruction of Anti-Personnel Mines" has been developed.
- ² Initial Article 7 report (April 29, 2003) indicates stockpiles total 165,080 mines and most recent Article 7 report (May 11, 2004) indicates that the destruction process is to start with the destruction of 3,030 mines.
- ³ Initial Article 7 report (2004) indicates stockpiles total 59,091 mines.
- ⁴ Most recent Article 7 report (April 28, 2004) indicates stockpiles totaling 204,227 mines and that the destruction process is expected to start shortly with the destruction of 189,227 mines.
- ⁵ First Article 7 report not yet due.
- ⁶ First Article 7 report not yet due.
- ⁷ First Article 7 report (due October 28, 2003) not yet available.
- ⁸ Most recent Article 7 report (May 11, 2004) indicates that destruction is in progress.
- ⁹ Initial Article 7 report (2004) indicates stockpiles totaling 44,548 mines and that the destruction process commenced in December 2003.
- ¹⁰ While HI supported the destruction of a small number of mines in Kisangani, most recent Article 7 report (June 2004) does not indicate that a national stockpile destruction plan has been developed.
- ¹¹ Article 7 reports have not been submitted.
- ¹² First Article 7 report not yet due but Landmine Monitor has indicated that Estonia does not have stockpiles.
- ¹³ First Article 7 report not yet due.
- ¹⁴ Most recent Article 7 report (May 13, 2004) indicates stockpiles total 3,997 mines and that destruction is in progress. The remaining stockpile destruction is scheduled to take place in the second half of 2004.
- ¹⁵ While first Article 7 report is not yet due, Landmine Monitor has indicated that AP mines are held.
- ¹⁶ Article 7 reports have not been submitted but according to UNICEF the Minister of Defence has indicated that Liberia has no stockpiled AP mines.
- ¹⁷ Most recent Article 7 report (June 18, 2004), indicates stockpiles total 5,000 AP mines and that destruction is scheduled for 2004.
- ¹⁸ While Article 7 reports have not been submitted, Namibia informed the Standing Committee on Stockpile Destruction on 12 February 2004 that stockpile destruction was completed before entry-into-force of the Convention.
- ¹⁹ Initial Article 7 report (due February 28, 2004) not yet available.
- ²⁰ First Article 7 report not yet due.
- ²¹ First Article 7 report not yet due.
- ²² Most recent Article 7 report (April 30, 2003) indicates stockpiles total 13,004 mines and that destruction is in progress. On 15 June 2004, Tanzania's Defence Minister was reported as saying that Tanzania will complete stockpile destruction on 24 July 2004.
- ²³ First Article 7 report not yet due.
- ²⁴ Most recent Article 7 report (June 8, 2004) indicates stockpiles total 1,483 mines and that destruction is in progress.
