**POINTS TO ASSIST STATES PARTIES THAT HAVE RETAINED ANTI-PERSONNEL
MINES IN ACCORDANCE WITH ARTICLE 3 IN APPLYING ACTION #54 OF THE
NAIROBI ACTION PLAN**

**Co-Chairs of the Standing Committee on the General Status and Operation of the Convention
(Belgium and Guatemala)**

The Co-Chairs have suggested that, in the spirit of Action #54, States Parties may wish to make presentations to the Standing Committee outlining matters such as the following with respect to the mines retained in accordance with Article 3:

- The quantity and type of mines retained and the manner in which the number of mines has changed since it was recorded in the Sixth Meeting of the States Parties' *Zagreb Progress Report*.
- The purposes for which retained mines have been used and the results of this use, including for example:
 - the mine detection, clearance or destruction techniques that have been / are being developed;
 - the mine detection, clearance or destruction training that has been carried out;
 - the number of personnel trained and to what standard.
- Plans for the further development of mine detection, clearance or detection techniques and further training which would result in the use of mines retained under Article 3.
