Notes on using the cover page:

1. The cover page could be used as a complement to submitting detailed forms adopted at the [First and Second] Meetings of the States parties in instances when the information to be provided in some of the forms in an annual report is the same as it would be in past reports. That is, when using the cover page, only forms within which there is new information would need to be submitted.
2. The cover page could be used as a substitute for submitting detailed forms adopted at the [First and Second] Meetings of the States parties only if all of the information to be provided in an annual report is the same as in past reports.
3. If an indication is made on the cover sheet that the information to be provided with respect to a particular form would be unchanged in relationship to a previous year's form, the date of submission of the previous form should be clearly indicated.

Form I Measures to provide warning to the population**Article 7.1** "Each State Party shall report to the Secretary-General ... on:

- 3) The measures taken to provide an immediate and effective warning to the population in relation to all areas identified under paragraph 2 of Article 5."

Remark: In accordance with Article 5, para 2: "Each State Party shall make every effort to identify all areas under its jurisdiction or control in which anti-personnel mines are known or suspected to be emplaced and shall ensure as soon as possible that all anti-personnel mines in mined areas under its jurisdiction or control are perimeter-marked, monitored and protected by fencing or other means, to ensure the effective exclusion of civilians, until all anti-personnel mines contained therein have been destroyed. The marking shall at least be to the standards set out in the Protocol on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Mines, Booby-Traps and Other Devices, as amended on 3 May 1996, annexed to the Convention on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Certain Conventional Weapons Which May Be Deemed to Be Excessively Injurious or to Have Indiscriminate Effects".

[Narrative]

As part of its commitment, the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) thru the Armed Forces of the Philippines Munitions Control Center (AFPMCC), is continuously conducting Ammunition Management, Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD) training and bomb disposal awareness procedures seminars every year to military and civilian personnel as part of the measures to provide warning to the population. Additionally, the Philippine Army, Philippine Navy, Philippine Air Force and the Philippine National Police each have Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD) units deployed in areas of armed conflict to dispose of Improvised Explosive Device and Unexploded Ordnance after hostilities occur. Moreover, the AFPMCC has been conducting Mine Ban Treaty lectures to AFP personnel.
