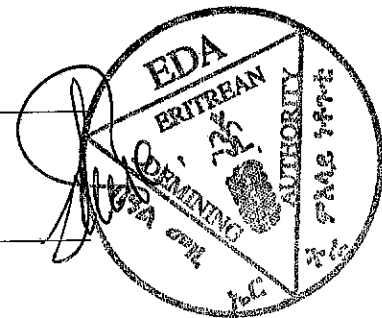

¹ These reporting formats informally provided by Austria on disk are based on document APLC/MSP.1/1999/L.4 of 31 March 1999, as amended and decided upon by the First Meeting of the States Parties to the Convention on the Prohibition of the U Stockpiling, Production and Transfer of Anti-Personnel Mines and on Their Destruction, held in Maputo from 3 to 7 May 1999. Tables of formats may be expanded as desired.

Article 7.1 "Each State Party shall report to the Secretary-General ... on:
a) The national implementation measures referred to in Article 9."

Remark: In accordance with Article 9, "Each State Party shall take all appropriate legal, administrative and other measures, including the imposition of penal sanctions, to prevent and suppress any activity prohibited to a State Party under this Convention undertaken by persons or on territory under its jurisdiction or control".

			<p>Eritrea does not possess any stockpiled mines. All mines possessed were laid in mine fields during the latest conflict. Only a small number of APMs are currently held at the Eritrean Demining Authority National Training Center.</p> <p>Eritrea does not produce mines, nor has it purchased any mines. All the mines we possess have been recovered from Ethiopian minefields or storage facilities. However thousands were broken, had missing parts, or were otherwise deteriorated, and were disposed / destroyed since they were of no use to the Army. All the remainder were laid in minefields, and due to shortages often recovered and re-laid. None remained in stockpile / storage after the 1998 – 2000 war.</p>

Note: This table initially provided a summary of 751 Mined Areas containing AP & AT mines based on LIS findings. To date 366 mined areas are cleared so far and the remaining mined areas were supposed to be 385. But since 49 mined areas are recently discovered by the survey teams, the remaining number of mined areas is 434.

Measures to provide warning to the population

Article 7.1 "Each State Party shall report to the Secretary-General ... on:

- i) The measures taken to provide an immediate and effective warning to the population in relation to all areas identified under paragraph 2 of Article 5."

Remark: In accordance with Article 5, para.2: "Each State Party shall make every effort to identify all areas under its jurisdiction or control in which anti-personnel mines are known or suspected to be emplaced and shall ensure as soon as possible that all anti-personnel mines in mined areas under its jurisdiction or control are perimeter-marked, monitored and protected by fencing or other means, to ensure the effective exclusion of civilians, until all anti-personnel mines contained therein have been destroyed. The marking shall at least be to the standards set out in the Protocol on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Mines, Booby-Traps and Other Devices, as amended on 3 May 1996, annexed to the Convention on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Certain Conventional Weapons Which May Be Deemed to Be Excessively Injurious or to Have Indiscriminate Effects".

Besides the Non-tech survey task, demining is conducted according to the priority need for safety of people and upon requests for construction and other development programs clearing 3 mined areas.

Non Technical survey is conducted in 5 regions cancelling 155 mined areas and 49 new mined areas were discovered which are out of the 543 reported last year.
