<p>A Law on the Implementation of the Convention on Cluster Munitions (CCM) and the Convention on the Prohibition of the Use, Stockpiling, Production and Transfer of Anti-Personnel Mines and on their Destruction (Ottawa Treaty)</p>	<p>The Ottawa Treaty was ratified by the Bulgarian National Assembly on 4 September 1998.</p> <p>On 24 November 2015 the National Assembly of the Republic of Bulgaria adopted a Law on the Implementation of the Convention on Cluster Munitions (CCM) and the Convention on the Prohibition of the Use, Stockpiling, Production and Transfer of Anti-Personnel Mines and on their Destruction (Ottawa Treaty). The Law entered into force on 8 December 2015. It prohibits any activities with cluster munitions and antipersonnel mines on the territory of the Republic of Bulgaria, except those permitted by the Conventions. The Law establishes legal definitions about Anti-personnel land mines (APLM), transfer and other key terms as well as regulates the conditions and procedures for transfer, transportation and destruction of APLMs and the control over these activities. For the first time the Bulgarian legislation incorporates principles and rules of international humanitarian law and ensures full realization of the rights of all APLMs victims. The Law provides for assistance to APLMs victims, including medical care, rehabilitation, as well as social and economic inclusion. The assistance includes not only the victims, but also their close relatives.</p>

VIDEX JSC	M2	31 336		<p>Transferred from Greece to the Bulgarian private company "Videx" JSC, village of Gorni Lom. After the incident from 1 October 2014 when 15 people died, the remaining 190 572 mines are stored in the warehouses of "Midzhur" factory, owned by Videx. The factory is no longer able to work with landmines. The Republic of Bulgaria has no capacity to proceed with the destructions of the remaining Greek landmines. Bilateral talks were initiated with Greece in 2015 for transferring the remaining stock back to the Hellenic Republic.</p> <p>A Greek expert delegation visited Bulgaria on June 29 – July 3 2015.</p> <p>In September 2015 and April 2016 the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Bulgaria sent Verbal notes to the Greek counterparts with a request for up-to-date information on the status of preparation of the Greek side to repatriate its APLMs back to the Hellenic Republic. We are waiting for the information to be delivered as soon as possible.</p>

*Remark:* In accordance with Article 5, para.2: "Each State Party shall make every effort to identify all areas under its jurisdiction or control in which anti-personnel mines are known or suspected to be emplaced and shall ensure as soon as possible that all anti-personnel mines in mined areas under its jurisdiction or control are perimeter-marked, monitored and protected by fencing or other means, to ensure the effective exclusion of civilians, until all anti-personnel mines contained therein have been destroyed. The marking shall at least be to the standards set out in the Protocol on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Mines, Booby-Traps and Other Devices, as amended on 3 May 1996, annexed to the Convention on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Certain Conventional Weapons Which May Be Deemed to Be Excessively Injurious or to Have Indiscriminate Effects".

As it was declared in form A, a new a Law on the Implementation of the Convention on Cluster Munitions (CCM) and the Convention on the Prohibition of the Use, Stockpiling, Production and Transfer of Anti-Personnel Mines and on their Destruction was adopted on November 24th

For the first time the Bulgarian legislation incorporates principles and rules of international humanitarian law and ensures full realization of the rights of all APM's victims. The Law provides for assistance to APM's victims, including medical care, rehabilitation, as well as social and economic inclusion. The assistance includes not only the victims, but also their close relatives.
