Dear Excellency,

The Republic of The Gambia is proud to be a State Party to the Anti-Personnel Mine Ban Convention.

The Anti-Personnel Mine Ban Convention has a foundation in transparency and mutual accountability. The Republic of The Gambia believes that these founding and guiding principles remain a vital to full and complete implementation of our Convention. The Republic of The Gambia therefore wishes to update States Parties in line with Article 7 of the Convention.

During the course of 2019, The Republic of The Gambia became aware of a previously unknown stockpile of 3000 VS 50 AP anti-personnel landmines in areas under its jurisdiction and control. The Republic of The Gambia was, until this point, unaware of the fact of this stockpile. We acknowledge that this generates a renewed obligation under Article 4 of the Convention and a similar obligation to report this to States Parties in a spirit of transparency and mutual accountability under Article 7.

It is in that spirit we present this update in line with our obligations. The disposal of antipersonnel landmines is underway in line with the requirements of The Convention and in line with the International Mine Action Standards (IMAS). We are grateful for the support of The German Federal Ministry of Foreign Affairs and the Mines Advisory Group (MAG) and hope to complete destruction in a timely manner.

We will provide further updates to States Parties in line with national reporting practice.

Please accept, Excellency, the assurances of our highest consideration.
