In 2020 the Slovak Republic provided a financial contribution of 50.000 EUR to UNMAS projects "Explosive Threat Mitigation - Enabling Returns in Liberated Areas" in Iraq and "IED Threat Mitigation Advisory Team".

In 2020 the National EOD and CBRN Centre Nováky organized seven national EOD courses dedicated to EOD specialists and pyrotechnics of the Armed Forces of the Slovak Republic and the Police of the Slovak Republic.

Moreover, in 2020 the National Centre for EOD and CBRN Nováky organized two international courses focused on EOD staff officers with 31 international participants from partner countries.

Between January and April 2020 the Armed Forces of the Slovak Republic represented by four Slovak EOD specialists in Resolute Support Operation provided mentoring support for commando courses dedicated to specialists of the Afghan National Army.
