South Africa's Article 7 report on the implementation of the Convention on the Prohibition of the Use, Stockpiling, Production and Transfer of Anti-Personnel Mines and on their Destruction for the period 1 January 2020 to 31 December 2020

In accordance with its obligations in terms of Article 7 of the Convention on the Prohibition of the Use, Stockpiling, Production and Transfer of Anti-Personnel Mines and on their Destruction, South Africa hereby submits to the APLC Secretariat its report on the implementation of the Convention for the period 1 January 2020 to 31 December 2020.

South Africa's Department of Defence and the South African Police Service continue to retain a limited number of anti-personnel mines, as permitted under Article 3 of the Convention, for the development of and training in mine detection, mine clearance, or mine destruction techniques.

## Holdings of the Department of Defence:

As mentioned in South Africa's last report for the period 1 January 2013 to 31 December 2013, the Department of Defence had at the time retained 500 anti-personnel mines. Stock levels as at 31 December 2020 stood at 483. Thus, during the period 1 January 2014 to 31 December 2019, seventeen (17) mines were disposed of as permitted under Article 3 of the Convention.

These mines continue to be held on behalf of the Department of Defence by the Defence, Peace, Safety and Security division of the Council for Scientific and Industrial Research and

## Holdings of the South African Police Service (SAPS):

A limited number of 62 mines are held by SAPS in terms of the exceptions permitted under Article 3 of the Convention. Minor fluctuations from South Africa's previous report for 2013 are as a result some were disposed of during development of and training in mine detection, mine clearance, or mine destruction techniques. A very limited number of recoveries were made during joint security operations with neighbouring mine-affected countries.
