\* Anti-personnel mines, the presence of which was declared by Ukraine as part of the implementation of Article 4 of the Ottawa Convention, are in the warehouses of the Armed Forces of Ukraine and will be destroyed in accordance with the commitments made after the cessation of hostilities and the restoration of the territorial integrity of Ukraine within its internationally recognized borders.

At the same time, if the warehouses and arsenals where anti-personnel mines are stored are located in the territories occupied by Russia, or they have been subjected to air and missile strikes by the armed forces of the Russian Federation, then information about such mines can be obtained only after the territory has been liberated, cleared and carrying out relevant inspections.

\* Given the continuation of intensive hostilities on the part of the Russian Federation, the Ministry of Defence of Ukraine currently lacks complete information on the coordinates of areas where anti-personnel mines may (probably) have been installed. 160,000 km<sup>2</sup> of territories on land and 14,000 km<sup>2</sup> of

water areas on which hostilities were/are being conducted are subject to preliminary survey. At the same time, the Ministry of Defence is actively conducting measures to check these issues in the de-occupied territories. Non-technical mine action operators (The HALO Trust, FSD, DRC) and national mine action operators Demining Soluton, Ukroboronservis were involved in the non-technical/technical survey of contaminated territories.
