i) The measures taken to provide an immediate and effective warning to the population in relation to all areas identified under paragraph 2 of Article 5."

Remark: In accordance with Article 5, para.2: "Each State Party shall make every effort to identify all areas under its jurisdiction or control in which anti-personnel mines are known or suspected to be emplaced and shall ensure as soon as possible that all anti-personnel mines in mined areas under its jurisdiction or control are perimeter-marked, monitored and protected by fencing or other means, to ensure the effective exclusion of civilians, until all antipersonnel mines contained therein have been destroyed. The marking shall at least be to the standards set out in the Protocol on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Mines, Booby-Traps and Other Devices, as amended on 3 May 1996, annexed to the Convention on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Certain Conventional Weapons Which May Be Deemed to Be Excessively Injurious or to Have Indiscriminate Effects".

For demining research and testing purposes Germany retains stocks of Directional Fragmentation Mines MON50 / MON100 / MON200 which are operated in the command-detonated mode only. All Tripwires and tripwire devices have been removed from these Mines. These are not anti-personnel mines, as defined in Article 2 of the 1997 Anti-Personnel-Mine Ban Convention and therefore not prohibited under the Convention.

The Federal Foreign Office, the Federal Ministry of Defense, and the German Red Cross publish the bilingual (English and German) omnibus publication "Documents on International Humanitarian Law | Dokumente zum humanitären Völkerrecht" (3rd edition, 2016; ISBN 978-3-89665-710-7). This publication includes, inter alia, the text of the Convention in German and English language.

Germany is a High Contracting Party to the Protocol on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Mines, Booby-Traps and Other Devices as amended on 3 May 1996 (Amended Protocol II) and the 2003 Protocol V on Explosive Remnants of War of the Convention on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Certain Conventional Weapons Which May be Deemed to be Excessively Injurious or to Have Indiscriminate Effects (CCW). Germany is a State Party to the 2008 Convention on Cluster Munitions and to the 2013 Arms Trade Treaty.

International Cooperation and Assistance (Article 6):

Germany does not distinguish between the different categories of explosive hazards (Anti-personnel Mines, Cluster Munition and other Explosive Remnants of War) in its humanitarian Mine Action or stabilization activities.
