#### National efforts to reduce ERW contamination:

As Lithuania is a mine free country no specific mine clearance programmes are required. However, there is a certain degree of contamination by explosive remnants of war (ERW) resulted from the First and the Second World Wars as well as pollution of former Soviet military bases.

In 2007 the Programme for Clearance and Prevention of Explosive Remnants of War for the years 2007-2020 was approved by the Government of the Republic of Lithuania. In 2013 the Programme was amended assigning more functions to the Fire and Rescue Department under the Ministry of Interior. In 2021, Ministers of Defence and Interior extended the Programme until 2027.

The primary objective of the Programme is to ensure that ERWs are detected, their potential threat to people prevented and adverse effects to private and public activities minimised. The Programme deals with the widest possible range of ERWs, including anti-personnel mines and anti-tank mines.

Lithuania started marking and ERW clearance activities in summer 2008. Engineer Battalion of the Armed Forces is tasked to clear contaminated territories and destroy the explosives.

In 2024, approximately 29 ha of contaminated territories were checked and cleared, 3908 pieces of different explosive ordnance were detected, removed and destroyed. From 2008 till the end of 2024 the Lithuanian Armed Forces EOD company inspected and cleared over 1064 ha of contaminated territories and detected over 41 083 pieces of different explosive ordnance (not counting small arms munition), i. e. anti-tank and anti-personnel mines, mortar bombs, artillery shells, grenades, sub munitions, aviation bombs, navy ammunition etc.

#### International cooperation and assistance:

Lithuanian Ministry of Defence in July 2023 announced initiative to launch the international Demining Capability Coalition for Ukraine. This coalition aims to address immediate mine clearance needs of Armed Forces and Ministry of Defence of Ukraine and to foster modern demining capabilities for the long term – providing equipment, training, and sustainability. To achieve the best results, Lithuania proposed that Iceland co-lead the Coalition, as the country had previously contributed to training Ukrainian soldiers in Lithuania through the Nordic-Lithuanian Explosive Ordnance Disposal Training Initiative. For the time being 23 countries are already involved in this coalition, and 12 of them have already joined the Cooperation Arrangement between Lithuania, Iceland and Ukraine concerning the Demining Capability Coalition Cooperation of 13 August 2024. Participation in the coalition is voluntary, allowing nations to contribute financially, in-kind, or through training efforts.

Representatives from the Lithuanian Armed Forces EOD unit participated in the international IEDD exercises *Northern Challenge* 2024 (Iceland), IED *Rodeo* (Germany), and EOD *Hussar* (Poland). These exercises focused on conducting various IEDD tasks and developing individual EOD operators' skills.

During the year 2024, Lithuanian Land Force training center organized Explosive ordnance clearance courses for Ukrainian military personnel.
