Form I Measures to provide warning to the population

 - i) The measures taken to provide an immediate and effective warning to the population in relation to all areas identified under paragraph 2 of Article 5."

Remark: In accordance with Article 5, para.2: "Each State Party shall make every effort to identify all areas under its jurisdiction or control in which anti-personnel mines are known or suspected to be emplaced and shall ensure as soon as possible that all anti-personnel mines in mined areas under its jurisdiction or control are perimeter-marked, monitored and protected by fencing or other means, to ensure the effective exclusion of civilians, until all anti-personnel mines contained therein have been destroyed. The marking shall at least be to the standards set out in the Protocol on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Mines, Booby-Traps and Other Devices, as amended on 3 May 1996, annexed to the Convention on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Certain Conventional Weapons Which May Be Deemed to Be Excessively Injurious or to Have Indiscriminate Effects".

All areas under the control of the Government of the Republic of Cyprus, in which anti-personnel mines are known or suspected to have been laid, have been identified and subsequently perimeter-marked, monitored by troops and protected by fencing and other means to ensure the effective exclusion of civilians, until all mines contained therein have been destroyed. The marking has been at least to the standards prescribed in Article 5.2 of the Ottawa Convention. Any mines located in the Turkish-occupied areas are not clearly perimeter-marked, not protectively fenced and not monitored by the Republic of Cyprus so as to ensure the effective exclusion of civilians (as stipulated by Convention Article 5.2). These omissions are due to Turkey's forcible military occupation preventing the Republic, the Sovereign Power throughout the territory of the Republic of Cyprus, from exercising effective control in the Turkish-occupied areas. Obviously, this situation maximizes the threat of those mines to the population and could cause further accidents.
