The marking shall at least be to the standards set out in the Protocol on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Mines, Booby-Traps and Other Devices, as amended on 3 May 1996, annexed to the Convention on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Certain Conventional Weapons Which May Be Deemed to Be Excessively Injurious or to Have Indiscriminate Effects".

Estonia continues to contribute financially to the United Nations Voluntary Trust Fund for Mine Action (5000 USD in 2011)

During 2009, the Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD) Center conducted Mine Awareness and Remnants of War familiarization and identification training to 1,178 school teachers and adults in support of Law Enforcement, Fire and Rescue, and Medical staff in First Responder roles. The Center's four regional bomb groups conducted compulsory awareness training at 108 regional locations, addressing 2,600 school children. Additionally, over 1,000 school-age children participated in the Rescue Board's annual Rescue Camp "Protect Yourself and Help Others", where the children were provided awareness training and participated in competitions including UXO identification and probable areas where UXO are normally found during each of the four seasons in Estonia.

In the 1<sup>st</sup> half of 2009 there was an EOD team (of up to fifteen personnel) in a 5-day deployability readiness in the structure of NRF-12 (NATO Response Forces). In 2013 Estonia plans to contribute one CMD team (5 people) in NRF.

From 2007 – 2009, Estonia was one of the lead nations of NATO/PfP Georgia II Trust Fund for the demilitarization of rockets and missiles in Georgia. The project comprised the demilitarisation of S-8 Air to Surface unguided missiles, and Alazan and Kristall anti-hail rockets. The cost of the project was EUR 478,214. Estonia contributed to the project EUR 30,000.

In the fall of 2009 NATO/PfP Trust Fund project on ERW including anti-personnel land mines' clearance and medical rehabilitation support to Georgia (NATO/PfP Georgia III Trust Fund) was launched. The lead nations of the project are Estonia, Lithuania and the Czech Republic. The objectives of the project are the development and enhancement of Georgia's Explosive Ordnance Disposal (EOD) capacity, through the provision of specialist EOD equipment and training to the Georgian Armed Forces and the provision of the establishment of a physical rehabilitation centre at the Military Hospital in Gori. Project implementation has been successful and is expected to be fully finished by July 2012. Estonia's contribution has been EUR 120,000.

The center, established in 1992 and consisting of four regionally located Bomb Groups, is subordinate to the Estonian Rescue Board (under the direction of the Ministry of Internal Affairs) and conducts civilian EOD operations and provides related training. Estonian EOD personnel have contributed to humanitarian demining operations in Afghanistan, and continue to conduct operations at home, in accordance with NATO and IMSMA standards.
