

Form I Measures to provide warning to the population

Article 7.1 "Each State Party shall report to the Secretary-General ... on:
 i) The measures taken to provide an immediate and effective warning to the population in relation to all areas identified under paragraph 2 of Article 5."

Remark: In accordance with Article 5, para.2: "Each State Party shall make every effort to identify all areas under its jurisdiction or control in which anti-personnel mines are known or suspected to be emplaced and shall ensure as soon as possible that all anti-personnel mines in mined areas under its jurisdiction or control are perimeter-marked, monitored and protected by fencing or other means, to ensure the effective exclusion of civilians, until all anti-personnel mines contained therein have been destroyed. The marking shall at least be to the standards set out in the Protocol on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Mines, Booby-Traps and Other Devices, as amended on 3 May 1996, annexed to the Convention on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Certain Conventional Weapons Which May Be Deemed to Be Excessively Injurious or to Have Indiscriminate Effects".

The warning to the population next to the former military training area WITTSTOCK, suspected to contain explosive remnants and mines, is regulated in "Ordnungsbehördliche Verordnung des Landkreises Ostprignitz-Ruppin zur Beschränkung des Betretens auf dem ehemaligen Truppenübungsplatz Wittstock" (official directive of responsible authorities about limitation of entry the former military training area Wittstock) set into force on 01. July 2011.

The area is completely perimeter marked. All entry ways into the Area are blocked with barriers.
