The Czech Republic in given period provided financial contribution to:

- Bosnia and Herzegovina through International Trust Fund for Demining and Mine Victims Assistance (ITF) 14.145 EUR. Part of the contribution is used to continue a project "The voice of mine victims in Bosnia and Herzegovina". The second part was earmarked to cover costs of demining activities in Brdjani-Remicke municipality;
- 2) Anti-Personnel Landmines Convention Secretariat (ISU) **4.343 CHF** on the implementation and universalisation activities of the convention;
- 3) Hashemite Kingdom of Jordan through NATO Explosive Ordnance Disposal project TF JORDAN III Woman's Training CoE in ERW 84.000 EUR;
- 4) Georgia through NATO for Explosive Ordnance Disposal project TF GEORGIA IV 45.400 EUR;
- 5) Serbia through NATO TF Serbia IV 20.000 EUR on development of the Serbia demilitarisation facility TRZ Kragujevac.
