

**CONVENTION ON THE PROHIBITION OF THE USE, STOCKPILING, PRODUCTION AND TRANSFER OF
ANTI-PERSONNEL MINES AND ON THEIR DESTRUCTION**

Form I Measures to provide warning to the population

Article 7.1 "Each State Party shall report to the Secretary-General ... on:

- i) The measures taken to provide an immediate and effective warning to the population in relation to all areas identified under paragraph 2 of Article 5."

Remark: In accordance with Article 5, para.2: "Each State Party shall make every effort to identify all areas under its jurisdiction or control in which anti-personnel mines are known or suspected to be emplaced and shall ensure as soon as possible that all anti-personnel mines in mined areas under its jurisdiction or control are perimeter-marked, monitored and protected by fencing or other means, to ensure the effective exclusion of civilians, until all anti-personnel mines contained therein have been destroyed. The marking shall at least be to the standards set out in the Protocol on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Mines, Booby-Traps and Other Devices, as amended on 3 May 1996, annexed to the Convention on Prohibitions or Restrictions on the Use of Certain Conventional Weapons Which May Be Deemed to Be Excessively Injurious or to Have Indiscriminate Effects".

State [Party]: REPUBLIC OF SERBIA reporting for time period from 01.01.2012. to 31.12.2012.

[At the end of 2009, it became aware that mine fields existed in the south of the country and that the mines had been planted by paramilitary forces during the armed conflicts in the area, in 2000-2001. Despite numerous problems, including no reporting on mining, a survey of that area has been conducted with the assistance of the Norwegian People's Aid and the International Trust Fund (ITF). The survey results have shown that the municipalities of Bujanovac and Presevo included 10 micro-locations where APMs had been planted. These micro-locations cover a total area of 1,385,215 square meters. Furthermore, the municipalities of Bujanovac and Presevo contain 53 micro-locations covering a total area of approximately 2,000,000 square meters, where surveys have been continued in order to confirm or refute the presence of AP mines.

Having in mind above mentioned, the Republic of Serbia decided to submit the request for the extension of the deadline to fulfill obligations arising from Article 5 of the Convention.]

Form J Other relevant matters

Remark: States Parties may use this form to report voluntarily on other relevant matters, including matters pertaining to compliance and implementation not covered by the formal reporting requirements contained in Article 7. [All anti-personnel mine victim survivors in Republic of Serbia are covered by the system of health care on all levels: emergency medical care, treatments, physical therapy and rehabilitation and supplying with P&O aids. The Law on professional rehabilitation and employment of persons with disability was adopted in our country and it entered into force on May 23, 2009. Provisions of law relating to the duties of the employer who employs fifty (50) employees to engage one person with disability entered into force on May 24, 2010.

Ministry for Labour, Employment and Social Affairs is keeping records of beneficiaries which is relevant for exercising their rights in the field of disabled veterans support and support to civilians, war invalids. Data base was established in 2009. Records are kept in the form of informative data base which contains: personal data, data on recognized status and rights, circumstances of wounding or death, type and level of physical impairment and socio-economic status of beneficiary. The abovementioned data base will be a starting point for the project coordinated by victim assistance expert, support by all relevant organisations that will lead to final and detailed data base of all mine victims.

Also, with regards to Cartagena Action Plan, Republic of Serbia plans to compile all existing regulations concerning all categories of invalids and families of war victims in one law which would regulate rights, conditions and scope of protection for that category of population.]
