

Draft Suggestion for use of the Form J to Report on Victim Assistance

**prepared by the ICBL Working Group on Victim
Assistance, Dec.4-8, 2000**

The President's Action Programme from the Second Meeting of the States Parties to the Convention on the Prohibition of the Use, Stockpiling, Production and Transfer of Anti-Personnel Mines and on their Destruction encouraged the following initiative for enhancing transparency in victim assistance programming:

“The SCE recommended that further work be undertaken to enhance transparency surrounding the implementation of, and compliance with, Article 6.3 of the Convention regarding the provision of assistance to landmine victims. Consequently, ICBL WGVA will continue its work to provide States Parties with guidance on how to effectively report on implementation of Article 6.3 of the Convention, including providing suggestions on how to use “Form J” in the amended Article 7 reporting format.”

To fulfill the request of the President's Action Programme on Victim Assistance, we submit the following suggestion for how to use “Form J. We welcome any additional suggestions you may have about how to use “Form J” for effective reporting on Victim Assistance.

Suggested outline for reporting on Victim Assistance (Article 6, Section 3)

Section 1

Care – includes programs, training, equipment, and transport for emergency medical care, continuing hospital care, amputation surgery, post-surgery medical care related to amputation or treatment of other landmine-related trauma.

Activity, funding and/or in-kind contributions	Implementing organization or agency*

Section 2

Rehabilitation – includes programs, training, equipment, and transport for physical rehabilitation such as physiotherapy, prosthetics and other assistive devices, and training/education of personnel in these fields. May also include psychological interventions as attached to the medical system.

Activity, funding and/or in-kind contributions	Implementing organization or agency*

Section 3

Social reintegration – includes psychological support to landmine survivors and/or their families, support to associations of people with disabilities, peer groups, peer counseling, support to sports programs for disabled participants and the training of relevant personnel such as social workers, therapists, and peer counselors to provide these services. Also includes development of appropriate disability policy and practices.

Economic reintegration – includes skill and vocational training programs, income generation and small business programs.
