The Nairobi Summit

Article 12 (1)

"A Review Conference shall be convened by the Secretary-General of the United Nations five years after the entry into force of this Convention"



The Nairobi Summit: 5MSP Decisions

- oThe First Review Conference to be held in Nairobi, Kenya, 29 November to 3 December 2004
- o2 preparatory meetings to be held in Geneva
- oKenya to designate a Secretary General
- oA <u>high level segment</u> at the end of the Conference and participation urged at highest possible level
- Ambassador Wolfgang Petritsch agreed to as President Designate of the Review Conference

The Nairobi Summit: Purpose: Article 12


- o"to review the operation and status of this Convention"
- $\circ \mbox{\tt "to adopt, if necessary, conclusions related to the implementation of this Convention"$
- \circ "consider the need for and the interval between further meetings of the States Parties"
- $\circ \mbox{\tt "to}$ take decisions on submissions of States Parties as provided for in Article $5\mbox{\tt "}$



The Nairobi Summit: Expectations

- ONot just a "Review" Conference but also forward-looking
- oFocus on the core humanitarian objectives (victim assistance, mine-clearance, stockpile destruction, universalization)
- oPreparation process needs to be inclusive and transparent
- oFinal documentation should be concise and to the point
- oThe result should be a strong political message: Let's finish the job!





The Nairobi Summit: Preparatory Process

oTransparency and inclusiveness are essential requirements for a successful Conference


 \circ Any State Party or relevant organization is invited to participate in and contribute to the process

oFriends of the President requested to assist President Designate in substantive preparation

oCanada, Mozambique, Nicaragua and Norway: To facilitate the Review, Plan of Action and Conclusions

oGermany and Malaysia: To facilitate the discussions about "Future Meetings" and related matters





The Nairobi Summit: Communicating the message

The Convention is working; more needs to be done!

- OAstonishing progress since entry into force.
- 0141 States have accepted the Convention.
- oAlmost 31 million stockpiled mines destroyed.
- oMajor strides have been made in clearing mined areas.
- oThe number of new mine victims has fallen dramatically



The Nairobi Summit: Communicating the message

The Convention is working; more needs to be done!

- oMore needs to be done to end the suffering caused by this weapon.
- oThe ongoing plight of landmine survivors still requires the attention of the international community.
- oThe elimination of anti-personnel mines must remain on the agenda of world leaders.



The Nairobi Summit: Prepare now!

High level representatives will be asked to do the following:

- oto renew their political and financial commitment to continue to eliminate anti-personnel mines and implement the Convention.
- **OMine-affected States Parties to further seize their responsibilities to clear mines and assist victims.**
- oto establish a concrete Plan of Action to fulfill the Convention's aims between 2004 and 2009
