

**Proposal for the selection of Co-Rapporteurs to serve between the end of the 10MSP  
and the end of the 11MSP**

**Co-Chairs of the Standing Committee on  
the General Status and Operation of the Convention**

**(Ecuador and Slovenia)**

**25 November 2010**

It has been our tradition that the Co-Chairs of the Standing Committee on the General Status and Operation of the Convention undertake the task of consulting with States Parties with a view to identifying a list of nominees to serve as Co-Rapporteurs. We have now concluded the process of developing a list of prospective Co-Rapporteurs for a decision to be taken at the 10MSP.

In undertaking our consultations, we have tried to keep in mind principles that have become customary to the Convention – principles like ensuring a regional balance, a balance between States Parties in the process of implementing key provisions of the Convention and other State Parties, and a balance between the need for rotation and the need for continuity – as set out in our letter to all States Parties dated 17 June 2010.

We are confident that the list below fulfils these principles to the extent possible:
