Thank you Mr. President,

Our delegation would like to reiterate some of the remarks that we have made in April's informal meeting.

The ISU's mandate was settled after an exhaustive evaluation in 2010. There is widespread appreciation for what the ISU does. Jordan, as a 'previously' mine affected State Party, certainly appreciates the support.

Jordan fully supports all discussions for actions to provide the ISU with the sustainable resources. For instance:

- The president is mandated to lead efforts to mobilize resources for the ISU and we, the States Parties, should assist in this endeavor.
- We already have the opportunity to actively be involved in the preparation of the ISU's annual work plan. The ISU has already aligned its 2015 work plan to the ambition we agreed to at the Maputo Review Conference. As the Maputo Action Plan extends for four more years, we could ask the ISU to prepare a four year work plan for adoption at the 14MSP. This would give us the predictive cost for a four year period and free us up to focus on acquiring the necessary resources.
- Individual States Parties already have the ability to notify the ISU about their intentions to contribute. It is

worrying that it is June and few States Parties have done so.

Jordan would also suggests that we keep in perspective the amount of money that we are talking about. The ISU consumes only approximately 0.5% of global mine action funding each year but makes a huge difference, particularly for mine affected States Parties.
