


History of the Mine Action in Turkey









- Turkey became a party to Ottawa Convention on 1 March 2004,
- Turkey ratified the Amended 2nd protocol of CCW on 2 March 2005,
- Destruction of stockpile APMs were completed by 2011 (Article 4 of the Convention),
- Initial deadline to fulfill commitment under Article 5 of the Convention has been extended until 1 March 2022 for Turkey,











- The Turkish Mine Action Centre (TURMAC) was established in 2015 by the Law 6586,
- A total of 167 mined areas measuring 28,5 million square meters were addressed with a total of 138.140 anti-personnel mines and 1.782 other explosive items having been identified and destroyed,
- The total remaining area to be addressed has been reduced from 172 million square meters to 143,5 million square meters over the period of 2014–2021,







Information
Management System

(IMSMA)

- TURMAC has issued "44 National Mine Action Standards (NMAS) within the frame of IMAS and 7 Standard Operating Procedures (SOP)" which are to be updated regularly and when needed,
- 32 manual demining teams and 2 machines and 6 Mine Detection Dogs (MDD) operating at the moment. 8 additional manual demining teams, 14 MDDs and 6 machines are projected in 2022,
- The IMSMA (V.6) system was established in 2018 and it has been fully operational, it contains all upto-date minefield and mine victim data and is used for all reporting and documentation including GIS.









- MDD training and accreditation sites have been constructed and 6 MDDs were accredited in 2021,
- Accreditation site for mechanical demining tools was constructed in 2020 and first tool was accredited according to international standards,









- TURMAC has developed and published an evidence-based, costed and time bound "National Strategic Plan for Mine Action" in Turkey which covers 2020-2025,
- In coordination with Ministry of Family and Social Services TURMAC has supplied various types of assistance (health, education, food, etc.) to mine victims,



Current Situation







• Minefields that were installed as a part of its Defence Policy (borders and military posts' security) in the past are now obsolete due to Integrated Border Management (IBM) system which has been constructed throughout borders.



Current Situation






• After seven (7) years of implementation (2014-2021) following the submission and approval of its first extension request, Turkey is not in a position to declare completion of its Article 5 obligations by the deadline.



Impeding Circumstances







- Circumstances which impede the ability of Turkey to address all the APMs in mined areas are;
 - Persistence of terrorist threat in the vicinity of Turkey's border areas for humanitarian demining,
 - Covid-19 pandemic that effected the Mine Action activities in terms of tender, procurement, travel, etc.
 - Topographical challenges particularly on the east and south-east region of Turkey,
 - Instability along the borders with countries such as Syria and Iraq,








• In order to fulfil its obligations in the context of Article 5, Turkey requests an initial extension request starting from 1st of March 2022 until 31st December 2025.









- During this three-year period, Turkey is going to:
 - Carry out Non-Technical Survey of mined areas remaining to be addressed in the context of Article 5;
 - Prepare a comprehensive and realistic clearance programme for 3692 mined areas in pursuit of NTS project
 - Continue its **EORE** and clearance efforts;

- Demining is funded by EU under IPA II (18.5 million €),
- Demining is planned in 4 provinces covering 96 minefields (4.2 million square meters) IOT find and destroy 88.500 mines,
- Project will be managed by UNDP and conducted by commercial contractors.

- Demining is funded by MoND budget,
- Demining is planned in Mardin province covering 44 minefields IOT find and destroy 13880 mines,
- Project will be managed by TURMAC and conducted by commercial contractor.



- NTS is co-funded by MoND budget (2,121 million €),
- NTS of all known (3.692) minefields in 14 Provinces will be conducted,
- Project will be managed by UNDP and conducted by commercial contractor and TURMAC.











- In addition to the abovementioned projects, during this three-year period;
 - Mine clearance activities will continue by means of military units,
 - 6 domestically produced demining equipment will be procured/deployed in 2022





• TURMAC "National Explosive Ordnance Risk Education Plan" (NEOREP), as a part of its Strategic Mine Action Plan (2020-2025) has three courses of actions which are aimed to be conducted simultaneously during 2021-2023.





- i. NTS teams will conduct **EORE** in 14 provinces,
- ii. Selected and accredited CSOs will deliver **EORE** in 3 provinces,
- iii. Turkish Gendarmerie Command will carry on **EORE 11 provinces**.

Humanitarian, Social, Economic and Environmental Implications of the Period (2022-2025)






- Considerable part of mined areas along the borders consists of arable land,
- Construction of a modern and humanitarian solution in replacement to mined areas continues to support the Integrated Border Management policy of Turkey.
