



Circumstances impeding completion



Challenges in the previous period

Covid-19 pandemic impacted clearance and survey operations with the complete shutdown of activities during March, April and May 2020



Limited capacities of the Ministry of Defense influenced planned land release numbers, hampering the overall results

> 11 km² of cleared land was not included in the results of the 2021 due to the fact there was very bad weather on the project area (*Karlovac Karst project, Velika Kapela mountain*) in the December 2021, therefore official Certificate of Land Release was published in the first quarter of 2022.

Annual National Government budget funds designated for the clearance activities in 2020 were reduced and reallocated to other areas towards the support of declining economic activities in the Country due to Covid-19 pandemic

Majority of funding comes from National budget, it is estimated that the total value of the remaining land release is approximately € 219 million – global economic circumstances could impede the planned release dynamics



Limited MoD capacities -Cooperation in the operational activities between the Ministry of Defense and the Ministry of the Interior / Civil protection Directorate was determined in 2021 with preliminary survey efforts. The planned joint activities of the Non-Technical and Technical survey will be aimed at further distinguishing CHA and SHA areas.


> In the 2022-2025 period the CHA under the MoD authority will be cleared with the support of the commercial sector based on the public tenders.

In 2022-2025 MoI/CPD capacities will support the MoD survey efforts with a projected goal of cancelling/reducing the SHA

Continue to provide care and rehabilitation, including psycho-social rehabilitation and economic reintegration of all mine and EO victims.

EO Risk Education and Victim Assistance efforts

Highlights in the 2019-2021 period

Continous EORE activities performed by the **Mol / CPD officials** in the landmine affected Counties/Municipalities

> In the 2019-2021 period **268 EO risk** educations with more than **28.000** participants were held

EORE activities at the specific EU project levels – project **"Naturavita"** construction of educational-visitor centre **"Podravlje"** where EORE education is provided as a part of wider nature protection educational eforts.

> During 2021, **20 EO** risk educations were held with **750** participants – preschool and school children

EORE and Mine Victim assistance efforts inside the Swiss-Croatian Cooperation Programme contribution, and a specific project named "Demining and Socio-Economic Integration"

Enhancement of the legal framework - a **new Law on Civilian Victims of the Homeland War** was officially adopted by the Croatian Parliament **in 2021**. This new Law enables the application for the status of a war-disabled civilian, based on a disability caused by a disease correlating with the Homeland War, including injuries from the ERW.

> This Law will provide the enhanced legal security to civilian victims of war including ERW survivors and families of individuals killed by ERW, all with a goal to greatly improve socioeconomic status of the victims.
