

IMPLEMENTATION SUPPORT UNIT 2023 BUDGET AND WORK PLAN

Submitted by the Director of the Implementation Support Unit Anti-Personnel Mine Ban Convention

Introduction

The following budget and activities are to be read in conjunction with the Implementation Support Unit's five-year work plan and budget covering the period of 2020-2024.

2023 Anti-Personnel Mine Ban Convention ISU Budget

Staff costs

The 2023 budget is intended to cover the salaries and related social costs of 3.6 full-time-equivalent staff positions. These positions include one full-time director, two full-time professional officers and one professional officer at 60 percent.

Travel costs

The 2023 budget is intended to cover the costs of an estimate of up to twenty-two (22) missions by ISU staff, including:

- Ten (10) missions for mine clearance support;
- Five (5) missions for the purpose of liaison and / or participating in conferences, UN meetings or similar events that relate to matters concerning the implementation of the Convention;
- Two (2) missions concerning preparations for the Fifth Review Conference, and;
- Five (5) missions concerning support to States Parties in the implementation of their victim assistance commitments.

As a rule, cost of staff travel is in economy class.

The travel costs presented are contingent upon the ability of the ISU to undergo travel unhindered in 2023. Taking into account that some obstacles may still exist in the aftermath of the pandemic, should some travel not be possible the funding for travel will be employed to support outreach with States Parties in a virtual manner, including by supporting in-country dialogues and virtual participation by the ISU as well as virtual dialogues.

Communication, public relations and other implementation support costs

Other implementation support costs include matters such as room rentals for committee meetings, catering for lunch-time meetings, online meeting platforms, working translations of requests for extended mine clearance deadlines and Article 7 reports, interpretation, publications, communications, website, online reporting tool maintenance, short term consultancies/support and staff training, etc.

Financial Security Buffer

At the time of drafting this work plan and budget, the financial security buffer contained a total of CHF 758'655, in line with the decision of the Fourteenth Meeting of the States Parties (14MSP) to ensure that the financial security buffer contains an amount equivalent to one year of ISU expenditures in order to guarantee the basic operation of the ISU for any foreseeable year.

Extra-budgetary activities

On 18 February 2021, the European Council adopted a Decision in support of the Oslo Action Plan (OAP) for the implementation of the 1997 Convention on the Prohibition of the Use, Stockpiling, Production and Transfer of Anti-Personnel Mines and on their Destruction with the ISU selected as the Implementing Agent. The Council Decision includes activities to support States Parties in the implementation of the aims of the Convention including in the areas of universalization, victim assistance, mine clearance, and stockpile destruction. The Council Decision was subsequently endorsed by the Coordinating Committee of the Convention.

The Council Decision includes funding for additional human resources to support the activities foreseen in the decision to ensure alignment with the decision of the 14MSP, in particular the matter concerning "extra-budgetary tasks".

The Council Decision will be carried out over a four-year period until 20 March 2025 and has a total budget of 2'658'139 EUR which includes funding to cover the cost of activities and additional personnel.

GICHD support to the ISU

Costs for infrastructure, logistics and administrative services in support of the ISU (i.e., office rent and supplies, information technology and telecommunications, website management, travel services, human resources management, insurance, financial management, and contract and document management), are not included in this budget. These costs are covered by the GICHD general budget with funds provided by Switzerland. The estimated value of these activities is a result of monitoring by the GICHD of actual levels of support provided.

The GICHD will also provide general administrative support to the ISU relating to the implementation of the European Union Council decision. The support of the GICHD in this regard, is compensated by the Council Decision.

Costs related to the administration of the Sponsorship Programme, including travel and accommodation services as well as reporting and auditing are covered by the GICHD, again on the basis of funds provided by Switzerland. The ISU provides Strategic direction to the Sponsorship Programme Coordinator.
