



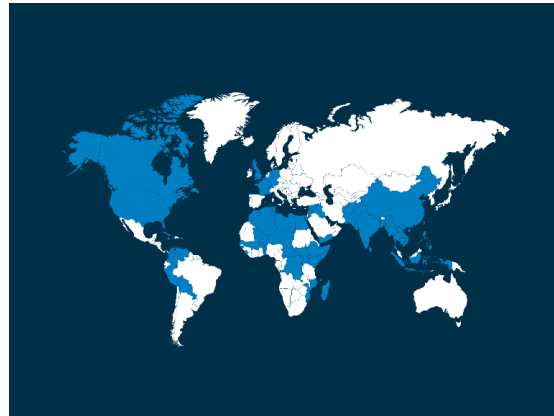

**Integrating Rehabilitation into the humanitarian
response**

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**Humanity & Inclusion (HI) is

Selected contexts :

Afghanistan context of sudden change /needed adaptation (PRC ,
mobile teams , risk education)

Aftermath of Irak and long term consequences on Victims (complex
care needed after initial delayed management)

Key Pillars of HI to improve access to Rehabilitation services in more general terms are :

- Mine action sector is implementing the International Mine Action Standard 13.10 on Victim Assistance .
- Evidence based practices placing the survivors at the centre of the response through use of outcome measures and victims feed back on needs
- Innovation and research to adapt to the fast changing context in humanitarian response relating to VA such as 3D printing of AP and telerehab services to bypass lack of access to care
- Ensuring a nexus centred approach within universal health coverage throughout the lifespan of Victims and their needs.

.Person centered Early rehabilitation services provision from onset of injury with particular attention to psychosocial wellbeing

.Ensuring continuum of care and services by supporting existing capacities and reinforcing the weakest links in the pathway of care within an accountable directory of services

.Adopt Data collection and User friendly outcomes measures that inform professionals , services users and caregivers about their status , progress and realistic expectation to rebuild their lives

HI 's core recommendations for Mine Action

Operationalize the IMAS 13.10 in order to facilitate access to services for people injured by EO, survivors and people otherwise impacted by EO by :

- **Placing the victims as the centre of Mine Action implementation**
- **Disaggregating Data collection, its analysis and dissemination on casualties**
- **Offering Information on available services in the area in which mine action efforts are carried out**
- **Integrating rehabilitation services and assistive technology provision across the pyramid of health systems, and as close as possible to communities**
- **Referral of explosive ordnance victims to relevant service providers through the appropriate government body with an accountable feed back system**
- **Supporting relevant national action plans and related coordination mechanisms including mobilisation of resources required to support VA**
- **Promoting and monitoring multi-sector engagement on specific issues related to victims with relevant actors in an effort to mobilise a multi-sector response .**
