

History of Mine Action in Ethiopia



- EMAO was established in 2001 and responsibility transferred to MOD on 2012.
- As at 30 April 2020, Ethiopia reported that it had a total of 152 suspected and confirmed hazardous areas with a size of 726km2 remaining;
- Landmine contamination is recorded in six out of the ten states in Ethiopia (62% of the areas known to contain antipersonal mines is found in Somali region (2020).

- As of 31 March 2021, Federal Democratic Republic of Ethiopia was able to cancel and reduce 110 areas measuring 330,341,076 square meters.
- 60,000 Sq Meter Erer Zone of Somali region
- 520 Sq Meter has bee cleared for road development in Somali region in 5 zones

Planned Activities

- conduct a desk assessment of remaining contamination in the database and conduct re-survey of mined areas as necessary to establish an up-to-date and accurate baseline.
- Strengthen technical capacity for emergency response while building block towards nation wide survey, and clearance

 - Victim Assistance








