A very good morning to all of you.

Mr. President,

The Malaysian delegation congratulates His Excellency Ly Thuch, Senior Minister of Cambodia and First Vice President of the Cambodia Mine Action and Victim Assistance Authority, on his election as President of the Fifth Review Conference of the Anti-Personnel Mine Ban Convention (APMBC). We also wish to commend the Government of Cambodia for hosting this significant conference, the Siem Reap-Angkor Summit on a Mine-Free World, and extend our gratitude for their warm hospitality.

Malaysia stands firm in its commitment to the APMBC, having been an early supporter of the Ottawa Process that led to its adoption. Moreover, Malaysia urges non-State Parties to accede to the Convention without delay and to contribute actively to the vision of a mine-free world.
