National Disability Policy

The Ministry and stakeholders have been implementing the National Disability Policy (2021 -2025)

The 33 standards seek to address issues of policy barriers across Ministries, Departments and Agencies/ levels/sectors.

The Policy mainstreams disability across all sectors so that disability issues are addressed at all levels and in all sector without discrimination.

Developed the National Disability Identification Assessment and Determination tool that will help registration of all persons with disabilities including victims of mines and explosive ordnants

COORDINATION

The National Technical Committee on the implementation of the National Disability Policy continued to meet on a quarterly basis.

The committee comprises of all Directors Gender, Inclusivity and Wellness in Government Ministries, Departments and Agencies, representatives from Organizations of Persons with Disabilities, Local Authorities, Development Partners, Private Voluntary Organisations, and Faith Based Organisations.

A similar committee has been set at Provincial level

Next year committee to be decentralized to district level including districts most affected by explosive ordnants of war

 - ix. Compensation of officials injured while performing duty (demining, emergency response)




Funding


Partners also funding registration of victims of landmines in two most affected districts
