Implementation of the **Republic of Angola's** commitments under the Siem Reap-Angkor Action Plan (SRAAP), particularly Actions 30 - 39





Focal Point - ANAM responsible for coordinating victim assistance as part of the Mine Action Programme in Angola, (Action 30).

ANAM **supervises and advocates** to improve the integration of victims in order to safeguard their rights, well-being and sustainability.

Victim Assistance has been integrated into national policies and plans on health, human rights, education, disability, gender and diversity, labour, poverty reduction and social protection.

IMPLEMENTED ACTIVITIES (Action 32)

- 'Participatory Assessment of the Socioeconomic Situation of Victims of Mines and other Explosive Ordnance' Project Prepared and Approved"
- Strengthened capacity of the National Authority to implement the project at national level.









OBJECTIVE

Ensure **emergency** and **continuous medical care** for all victims and their families nationwide, especially in **rural** and **remote areas**.







- **Expanded** emergency and continuous medical care services in all municiplaities.
- New health units inaugurated and equipped in the provinces of Huíla and Huambo, and 5 new general hospitals in the provinces of Luanda, Kwanza-Sul, Kwanza-Norte and Cunene.
- Implementation of the Integrated Municipal Intervention Plan, which aims to rehabilitate and build new health facilities in all municipalities.
- **Expansion** of the services provided by Angola's national institute for medical emergencies (**INEMA**)
- Training of health professionals working in the new hospital units









OBJECTIVE

To guarantee and ensure comprehensive and innovative physical rehabilitation services for all victims and their families at national level, especially in rural and remote areas.





IMPLEMENTED ACTIVITIES (Action 35)

- The country's Orthopaedic Centres and other similar units were expanded and equipped with physiotherapy and physical rehabilitation facilities and services
- New specialists trained nationwide



BENEFICIARIES

- **3,529 Physiotherapies:** 1,181 Children; 1,088 Women; 1,260 Men
- **20 Cructhes:** 6 Children; 7 Women; 7 Men
- **12 Prostheses:** 5 Children; 4 Women; 3 Men









OBJECTIVE

To guarantee and ensure psychological and psychosocial assistance and support for all victims and their families at national level.





IMPLEMENTED ACTIVITIES (Action 36)

- Expanded psychological and psychosocial assistance and support services, carried out by different specialists mainly from the health units assigned to the Ministry of Health.
- The Angolan Association of Psychologists organised campaigns to provide free care to health units in the municipalities.
- The NGOs IEBA, IACV, AACVDA and ANDA visited victims in the provinces of Luanda, Zaire, Bengo and Cabinda.







OBJECTIVE

To guarantee and ensure **socio-economic inclusion** in the fields of education and skills development, social inclusion, employment and social protection for all victims and their families at national level, especially in **rural and remote areas**.





IMPLEMENTED ACTIVITIES (Action 37)

- Implementation of the National Plan for the Inclusion and support of People with Disabilities (PLANIAPED 2023-2027);
- Increasing economic inclusion services, entrepreneurship and improving social security policies
- Greater access to public services and social participation.



BENEFICIARIES

- 64 women received entrepreneurship training in Huambo province;
- 30 families received basic food baskets and essential goods;
- 4 families were enrolled in the Anda Moto company;
- 900 children and young people received free education and training in the provinces of Luanda and Huambo.
