

THIRD EXTENSION REQUEST FOR THE COMPLETION OF ARTICLE 5 OBLIGATIONS UNDER THE OTTAWA CONVENTION

Geneva 17 – 20 June 2025

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Key progress during the current extension period

- Release of 147,869,036 m² of land corresponding to 950 areas;
- Reduction of accidents among the population;
- > Example: 2021 (36) now in 2025 (8).
- Socio-economic impact (free movement of people and goods, rehabilitation and development of infrastructures, agricultural activities and promotion of tourism etc).










Main reasons for non-completion of the obligations of the current extension request

- Reduction in funding;
- Discovery of previously unidentified mineflieds;
- Complexity of some minefields (no definied standards);
- COVID 19;
- Lack of mined maps and records among others.










Remaining challenges

- Extensively implement explosive ordnance risk education activities;
- Clear a total of 57,068,936 m² of land corresponding to 965 hazardous areas registered in the national database;
- Mobilize additional funds for the implemention of operations in the provinces with remaining contamination;










Remaining challenges (Cont.)

- Clearing large complex minefields with mines hard to detect in the provinces of Bié, Cuando, Cubango, Moxico and Moxico Leste with a total of 557 mined areas correspoding 29,492,885 m² which represents 51,68% of total contamination;
- Restructure and equip public operators with personnel and equipment to reinforce current capacity.









Duration of next extension request (2026-2030) and justification

- A 5-year extension is requested: (From January 2026 to December 2030);
- The remaining contamination at the end of 2025 is expected to be approximately 50,000,000 m²;

Duration of next extension request (2026-2030) and justification – (Cont.)

- With the existing capacity, land release in recent years has been between 8,000,000 and 9,000,000 m²;
- By strengthening the operational land release capacity aimed at complying with Article 5, it is hoped that it will be possible to release at least 10,000,000 m² per year.









Planned activities for the next extension request 2026 – 2030 (Cont.)

 Revitalizing explosive ordnance risk education activities;

 Strengthen the operational land clearance capabilities of public operators in all provinces, aimed at complying with Article 5;









Planned activities for the next extension request 2026 – 2030 (Cont.)

- Effectively implement land release methodologies, with emphasis on the cancellation and reduction of areas;
- Gradually complete demining in the provinces with the least contamination and consequently commence managing residual contamination;









Planned activities for the next extension request 2026 – 2030

 Strengthen operational capacity in the most contaminated province










Assistance needed to reach completion

- Continued funding for public and humanitarian operators;
- Technical and operational assistance in terms of appropriate technologies and procedures for demining areas with a high number of mines with low metal content;









Assistance needed to reach completion – Cont.


- Permanent interaction with the Geneva International Center for Humanitarian Demining in various areas, with emphasis on technical assistance and the full and effective implementation of the IMSMA Core tool;
- Interaction and cooperation with Partners to ensure Capacity Building and Institutional Strengthening.
