

### Progress of the previous extension period

# 01 January 2020 to 31 December 2024: Progress:

• Released **884,294,412** square meters of land contaminated by anti-personnel mines through NTS (16%), TS (30%), and clearance (54%).






### Progress of the previous extension period

## Reasons for not completing obligations during the previous extension period

#### **CHALLENGES:**



- Shortfall in funding due to the COVID-19 global impact and international funding priority shifting.
- The magnitude of the remaining problem



 Needs to address other types of ERW contamination, namely anti-tank mines, cluster munitions, UXO, underwater contamination, and aerial bombs.



Discovery of new minefields:
 49% of mine accidents over the past decade (2015–2024) occurred outside the recorded minefields,




Geographical

 Border Challenges: Challenges along the border between Cambodia and Thailand, including incomplete demarcation, hinder the clearance of minefields in this area.



Cambodia requires **US\$ 116,988,192,** subject to recalculation based on the updated anti-personnel mine contamination data after completing the comprehensive survey by June 2025, to address the challenges in the national database during this 5-year extension period.
