 Zimbabwe has demonstrated its commitment to eradicating landmines through various initiatives and has submitted five extension requests

Zimbabwe to continue its vital efforts toward a mine-free future





Achievements and Progress during the 5th Extension Period

Handover of Sheba Forest to Lincoln Hill by Norwegian
People's Aid (NPA) in 2022, a stretch of 52 km frontage



 86.7 km frontage of the Musengezi to Rwenya minefield in Mt. Darwin district by HALO Trust in 2021



 Muzite to Rusitu minefield, a stretch of 73km has been completed by NPA and awaits handover



 Under the 5th Extension period, a total area of 56,593,573 m was released with 218,024 AP mines destroyed.
