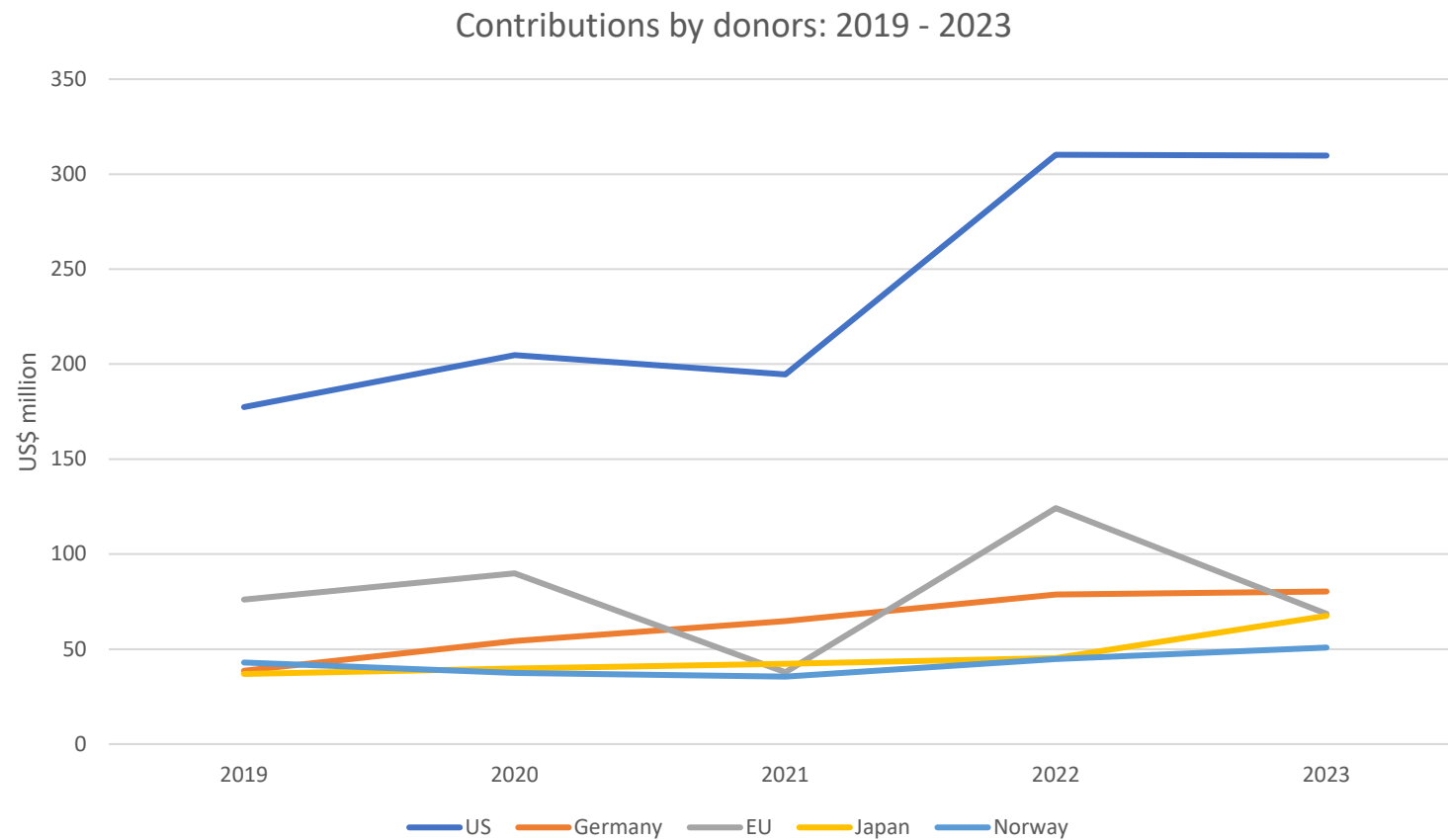

Global Funding Trends in relation to the MBT

- **Reliance on a small number of traditional donors** for most mine action support
 - **US, Germany, EU provided 58%** of all international support for MA 2019-2023
- **Reduction in funding** by some key MA donors
- The **US** has been the **largest donor to MA since 1993**

In 2023:

- Of the **33 States Parties** with Article 5 obligations, **19 received funding from the US**
 - Afghanistan, Angola, BiH, Cambodia, Colombia, Croatia, DRC, Iraq, Palestine, Serbia, Somalia, South Sudan, Sri Lanka, Sudan, Tajikistan, Thailand, Ukraine, Yemen, Zimbabwe

Global Funding Trends in relation to the MBT

Landmine Monitor 2024

- A large proportion of funding is provided to a few key countries. From 2019-2023:
 - **75% of all international funding over the 5-years went to 6 States Parties** – Ukraine, Iraq, Afghanistan, Colombia, Cambodia and Yemen
- Some SP with **medium or small contamination** have struggled to obtain international funds. From 2019-2023:
 - **6 affected States Parties** – Chad, Ethiopia, Mauritania, Niger, Nigeria and Senegal – **received less than 1% of all international funding**

Opportunities

- **SP to the Mine Ban Treaty** have been consistent funders of mine action, providing almost half (49%) of all international funding 2019-2023
- SP committed to the following under the Siem Reap-Angkor Action Plan 2025-2029
 - Action 40 - “commit the necessary national and international resources and **explore new mechanisms** for fostering cooperation and assistance...”
 - Action 41 – **Develop resource mobilisation plans** and clear reporting on challenges and requirements for assistance
 - Action 44 – To “explore the **feasibility of establishing a VTF** to support affected States Parties struggling to secure international assistance...”
